

## KBIS X-Ray Requirements for horses purchased at £20,000 and above

Front Feet Lateromedial (LM)

Dorsoproximal – Palmarodistal Oblique (D60Pr-PaDio) for pedal

bone

Dorsoproximal – Palmarodistal Oblique (D60Pr-PaDio) for

navicular

Palmaroproximal – Palmarodistal Oblique (Pa45Pr-PaDio) flexor

## **Conditions**

- In the interest of getting an accurate assessment, Underwriters request that radiographs be supplied as DICOM images. This is in line with VDS advice to all Veterinary Surgeons offering opinions on x-rays as other formats may not be as detailed and can lead to inaccurate interpretation.
- Both front shoes to be removed
- Each X-Ray image must be dated and labelled with the name of the view and the horses name

The x-rays listed above are a requirement of your insurance policy. As noted on the pre-purchase veterinary certificate and recommended by the British Veterinary Association and the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons, it is advisable to submit your vet's certificate and x-rays to your insurer prior to purchase of the horse. This is to ensure that you can obtain insurance cover that meets your needs. It is possible that whilst your vet has recommended the horse for purchase, noting various conditions, Underwriters may exclude these conditions (noted on the pre-purchase certificate) and all findings on x-ray if they consider they represents an increase risk for the insurer. To avoid disappointment, check with your insurer first.

The cost for a review is £95, however if you take out a policy with KBIS, the £95 would be deducted from the premium.
